

Verbal Boundary Description

Acreeage 7.3 ACRES

Beginning at the intersection of a driveway and the western right of way of Hwy 68, point A, said point being at the NW corner of said intersection; thence W along the northern edge of said driveway 610' to the NW corner of a barn at point B; thence S along the western edge of said barn and a gate on the S of said barn 55' to a fence post and intersection of a fence line at point C; thence W along said fence 30' to the intersection of another fence at point D; thence S along said fence 200' to the intersection of another fence at point E; thence W along said fence 100' to the intersection of another fence at point F; thence S along said fence 200' to the northern right of way of Hwy 68 at point G; thence following the northern and western rights of way bounding Hwy 68 N and W to the beginning. The boundary incorporates the well defined living space of the Lisle house with a significant barn outbuilding approximately 300' N of said house and the Brents log home.
