ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE This house illustrates the ubiquity of the "McClelland" house form, found in Davenport from one end of the 19th century city to the other, with most occurances near the central area. In this house, the typical three-bay front-gable form is distinguished from other examples by the full-height side wing and the large parlor window at the front (in place of the more common sash windows).

H. Henry Pohlmann moved to this address in 1898, HISTORICAL DATA though the house may have been at this location for several decades. Pohlmann was a brick manufacturer with the family firm H.B. Pohlmann Sons.
