Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Herrera family house is a typical early 20th. Century neo-classical high family income residence. Its principal elements, the stylized octagonal estriated corinthian columns, recessed molded balcony ceiling rectangles, ornated front balcony iron ornamental castings, native primitive ceramic floor tiles, double scrolled molded upper door frame frontispieces, simple and highly ornated upper peripherical moldings and the ever present upper roof balustered balcony. (See Exhibits 27A, B,D).

The interior has been disposed with living areas in the center with summetrically disposed sleeping quarters and toilets. Ceilings are tongue and grooved wood planks with low relief highly ornated moldings. Doors are louvered (outside) and eliptically molded (both outside & inside) with turned wood bollards coronating the upper molded door frames, estriated side molded jambs are typical of all door openings. (See Exhibits 27E,F,G,H).

Dividing the center nave into living, family and dining rooms, we find filigreed arches, arcades, supported by turned wood and octagonal estriated columns; with and without balustered side balconies. (See Exhibits 27F,G).

The front elevation contains five modified corinthian columns supporting the main molded upper frontispiece (highly ornamented) and the roof perched balustered balcony and the long gone planting urns. Four louvered wood doors, each with double scrolled convolutes frames and upper moldings and glazed oval openings. (See Exhibits 27A,B).

Both side and posterior elevations have been altered to show louvered metal windows (miami's) · (See Exhibits 27B,C).

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

This residence was built in 1914 and is a design by Manuel Gómez Tejera. The construction phase was supervised by Juan Cedillo, a well-known construction supervisor. Its original owner, Juan López Suárez, passed the property to his daughter, Juanita López and sister of the present owner, Carmen López. During the years from 1940 to 1958, it was leased to the then President of the University of Puerto Rico, Juan Bautista Soto, to Juan Rosa Silva, and to the District Engineer.

Since 1958, the residence has been occupied by its present owner, the daughter of the original owner. The structure is one of the most important existing examples of the Gómez Tejera style of design and certainly worthy of being preserved. Its balcony, framed by slim columns, fronts upon the neo-classic building which now houses the Art Museum and together they form an architectural group, very pleasant to the sight of the residents and visitors of Aguadilla.
