

- #76 <u>Tony Manzanares House</u>, ill. 66, 30' E of the Los Ojos Road and 0.3 miles N of La Puente Church.
  - 4. <u>Owner</u>: Tony Manzanares, Sr., La Puente Rt., Tierra Amarilla, 87575

7. Description: foundation unknown; mud plaster over hewn horizontal logs with end notching (main) or jacal (rear addition); 6/1 double hung windows; corrugated metal gable and shed roof (rear), horizontal plank in gable, exposed (unmilled) pole rafters.

Located at the bottom of an east-west field, beside the Los Ojos Road, just above the drop-off from the first plateau to the river.

8. <u>Significance</u>: Built in the 1930's, this house indicates the continuing vitality of log construction and the local housing tradition. Tree ring samples could determine if the hewn logs were reused from an earlier building, as often happened, or cut fresh for this house, which seems unlikely at this late date. Numerous other examples of jacal remain from this decade. The use of unmilled poles for rafters suggests the builders lacked money. It is probably a one-room "honeymoon" house.

10. Acreage: under 1. UTM Ref: 13 357330 4063340

Boundary: A rectangle, roughly 50' by 45', formed by a line parallel to and ten feet from the house walls.
