and closing the firsplace on the west wall. There is an artificial fireplace on the north wall now. Casement windows now open outward, instead of inward. There is no basement and no attic. The laundry room is on the first floor.Upstairs, the bathroom floor is one seep above the hallway. There is storage space provided under the roof.

This house is architecturally significant because it is one of a group of stone masonry houses built by Arnold F. Meyer according to Ernest Flagg's system of construction. It is also significant because it is one of four homes built by Meyer for membersof his own family. This house was built for his brother-in-law Otto Fiebing.
