Architectural Description and Significance: This 1 1/2 story Flagg System home faces north and has asymmetrical window and door openings. The exterior walls are limestone. There is a wood shake shingle gable roof. There is a square two story tower on the NE corner of the house with hip roof. There are four chimneys, three of which have distinctive round openings and two of which are false. There is one pair of ridge dormers and one gable dormer. The original builder shared a driveway to the west with the occupant of that house. nomination. The living room originally had a limestone fireplace, but the present owners covered it with marble. They also replaced the tile sills on the inward opening casement windows with marble. The second floor was unfinished in 1970 when the house was purchased by the present owner. He finished the upstairs to include bedrooms and bath. There is storage space under the roof and Flagg hinges on casement windows upstairs.

This house is architecturally significant because it is one of a group of homes built of stone masonry by Arnold F. Meyer & Company, Inc. according to construction methods of Ernest Flagg.
