Architectural Description and Significance:
 This two-story rectangular Flagg System house faces west and has an attached garage. It is capped by a steep hip roof with composition shingles. The window and door openings are asymmetrical. There are one pair of ridge dormers, five gable dormers, and two chimneys with distinctive round openings. Inside, the house has a beam and girder ceiling on the first floor. The casement windows open inward over tile sills. There is a partial basement. The bathroom floor is one step up from the 2nd floor hallway. There is an airing porch over the garage.
