Architectural Description and Significance: <b>This 1 1/2 story Flagg System house faces east. Its dimensions are 47 x 58 feet. There are limestone exterior walls. The entrance is in a one story octagonal tower with conical roof, linking one story ell with the rest of the house. Windows and door openings are assymetrical. There is a composition gable roof, two pairs of ridge dormers, ten gable dormers, and two chimneys with distinctive round openings. The original garage is attached. The living room in the 1 story ell has a stone fireplace. Casement windows open inward over tile sills. vestibule opening into the living room, at one end, the dining room at the other, and a powder room and stairs to the second floor in between. The living room has a rafter ceiling with tie beams. There is a partial basement. A laundry room is just two steps down from the kitchen. A cabinet is open to the laundry and to the powder room. The kitchen has been remodeled with pine paneling. There is a partial attic and storage space under the roof. The upstairs partitions are 1 3/4 " thick. Neighboring houses are quite large. This house is architecturally significant because it is one of a group of stone masonry houses built by Arnold F. Meyer & Company, Inc. according to the construction methods of Ernest Flagg. It is also distinctive because its plan is very similar to that of the house on Glendale but in reverse.
