

- 4. Owner: David Lopez, 915 2nd, Las Vegas, N.M.
- 7. Description: Wood shingles over hipped roofs, dormers, and bay; small enclosed eaves with wooden "modillions"; 1/1, 3/1, 4/1, double-hung windows, casement windows; single door with transom; lumberyard classic columns; endboards treated as pilasters. This wood frame house is the middle of three nominated structures facing a triangular park. (See previous page for fuller location description.)

The addition of a garage, asbestos shingles and window grates have done little to undermine the overall integrity of the structure.

- 8. <u>Significance</u>: This house plan was used at least three times locally: here, for the house to the north, and, in mirror image, for a North New Town District house (#455). Its symmetrical, hipped roofs combine with the remainder of asymmetry given by the bay and porch to make this a modest but well done example of the local Free Classic style. Its place in a small cluster of historic features is discussed on the previous page, Building #293.
