

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#1603 James Cook House, 1017 11th, ill. 59.

- 4. Owner: Robert Bonin, 1017 11th, Las Vegas, N.M.
- 7. Description: Random ashlar sandstone foundation; aluminum siding over wood frame; wood shingles on truncated hipped roof; small boxed overhang; 1/1 double hung windows with wood surrounds; single door with transom; chamfered porch posts with molding "bases," horizontal grooves and spindle brackets; fish scale wood shingles on porch end. Located in the eastern portion of the Sulzbacher and Rosenwald Addition, described earlier with Building #1559.
- 8. Significance: An earlier, fine example of the local Hipped Box type. Symmetry of plan and openings topped by a truncated hipped roof became common at the turn of the century. The picturesque wood work of the porch--chamfered and grooved posts, and spindle brackets--is a holdover from a slightly earlier era. The 1906 directory records James Cook a telephone lineman, living here; the 1919 one, James Cook, electrician and wife.

Boundary: Lots 19-20 of Block 6 of the (Lopez) Sulzbacher and Rosenwald Addition.
