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Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Burlington Tavern is a two-and-one-half story wood frame structure with a gable roof and clapboard siding. The principal (south) elevation is five bays wide with a central entrance. The door is flanked by sidelights and pilasters. Extending across this facade is a veranda supported on turned posts with brackets. Extending from the rear of the tavern is a two story ell which, on the north side, has wood shingles instead of clapboards. The windows throughout the building consist of cwo-over-two double-hung sash. There are also two gable roof dormers on the west slope of the ell roof which have original six-over-six lights. There are three brick chimneys, one at each end of the main section of the house and one for the ell.

The only major alterations occurred during the late nineteenth century when most of the sash was replaced and the veranda was added. The door, however, is a modern replacement.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Old Tavern in Burlington is a remarkably well preserved example of an early inn and tavern catering to lumbermen and drivers during the height of the lumber industry in Maine. Now a sleepy community, it was once a bustling and rough town on the Passadumkeag River and this building was filled with hard living, heavy drinking men during the season of the log drive.

It was built by Amzi Libby who came to Burlington about 1834 from Limerick, Maine. When he acquired the lot at "the corner" in 1844 he built the tavern which served as a hotel for lumbering crews driving down the Passadumkeag or who were working in the Nicatous area.

Jeremiah Page bought the tavern from Charles R. Libby, a son of Amzi, in 1864. He became a very prominent citizen both as a merchant and innkeeper, serving also as selectman, town clerk and Justice of the Peace.

In later years the tavern became a very popular headquarters for hunters and fishermen in the area.
