

Architecturally, this multi-unit dwelling is derived from the American foursquare style, a popular form in the early 20th century in the South Branch Valley and throughout the United States. Except for the large size of the house, the architecture of the building is of secondary importance. Its primary significance, derives from its humanitarian contribution to the social history of Pendleton County. Illustrated by this large dwelling is a turn-of-the-century period social program developed by the county to provide shelter for indigents in exchange for their work on the farm. The farm was intended to be self sufficient, and as far as can be determined, operated in that manner until its operation ceased later in the 20th century.
