Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Freund store and house site on the east side of State Road #5 in Johnsburg. It is one of the principle buildings in Johnsburg, the others of which are the St. John the Baptist church, school and rectory immediately to the north of the Freund store. These buildings constitute the center of Johnsburg.

The house and store are wood frame structures attached to form an El, with the house set back on the south side of the store parallel with the street. The store is two tall stories with a hipped roof and a front facing narrow facade; the house attached below the eave line of the store is two shorter stories tall with a hipped roof with the long rectangular side of the house facing the street. Ther store and house both have symmetrical front facades. Both are sheathed in 4"-wide clapboards, and have cornerboards, corniced window moldings, a wide frieze with paired brackets, and a sandstone foundation. The house has 1-over-1 double-hung wooden windows; the store, 2-over-2.

The complex is in virtually original condition. The storefront is intact as built with fluted corner pilasters with wooden finials up to the top of the first floor, and intact original display windows and storms. The central angled entry of the store is enclosed below the glass transom in wooded storm protection panels original, or almost so, to the building. The front porch of the store consists of a platform which extends to the sidewalk. The house has two pairs of windows on both floors on the north and south ends of the front facade. It is fully attached to the store on the north. At the first floor is a central door leading onto a wooden small porch/portico.

The interior of the store has a high wooded ceiling, original display cases in oak, and tongue and groove wainscotting. The back bar in the rear of the store came from the first saloon and store owned by the Freunds and built in 1880 on the lot immediately south of the store and house. Above the store is a hall for social gatherings.

Only two evident changes have occurred to the store and house over the years. A south ourside stairway leading to the second story hall has been removed. The door at the top has been clapboarded over, but its configuration can still be seen. The house used to have a full and open porch with a shed roof and turned porch columns running along the east side of the first floor. It has been replaced with a smaller entry portico with a front-facing gable. Otherwise the two joined buildings are in original condition.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Freund house and store is significant as the leading and oldest commercial establishment in Johnsburg. With its upstairs hall and downstairs store, it was the social and commercial center of the community for 87 years until 1967 when the store closed. The current store and house built in 1895, replaced the Freund's first store and saloon, built by Peter Freund and his wife in 1880 on the lot immediately to the south. During its operation, the store drew customers from the surrounding area of southern Minnesota and Mitchell County, Iowa. The Freund's were closely identified with the German Catholic community which settled around Johnsburg.

Peter and Christina Freund moved to Johnsburg in 1880 and built a general store and saloon, which they replaced with the present store and house immediately to the north of the first one in 1895. Peter and Christina moved into the new house and ran a general merchandizing operation from the store until Prohibition forced a closing of the old saloon and it was razed in the 1920s. In 1909, John S. Freund, Peter's son, was one of three carpenters who helped to build the new St. John the Baptist rectory next door. During Prohibition, John traveled to Blooming Prairie in Steele County to buy beer for the German customers around Johnsburg. Mower County then was a dry county.

After Peter Freund died in 1904, this three sons operated the saloon and store until John S. became sole owner in 1918. Christina died in 1923, and John S. and Catherine Freund, his wife, operated the store. They saw the arrival of the automobile and the coming of electricity, which meant that ice for the groceries no longer had to be cut on the river and stored in the ice house behind the store. During the 1920s, John's son, Isadore, enclosed a truck and delivered groceries, dry goods, and supplies to his customers in the surrounding area.

Isadore and his wife moved into the house in 1926 when they were married. In 1933 when Prohibition came to an end, the Freunds decided to use the back part of the store for a bar area. The bar from the old saloon that was torn down in the '20s was installed and is there today. John S. Freund was murdered by three robbers in 1934 and the operation of the store passed to his son, Isadore. Isadore and his wife, Catherine, operated the store with help from their children from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., and, later, with help from other family members and friends. The store closed on November 5, 1967, and Isadore died in 1968.

From 1895 until 1967, the Freund store was the most popular social spot in Johnsburg and the surrounding area. People gathered there to visit after masses on Sunday mornings at John the Baptist Church next door. Fathers

played cards and waited to pick up their children from the parish school adjacent to the store. The multi-purpose hall on the second floor was a popular gathering place for the community. Plays were performed there and the original stage curtain still hangs in the hall above. Professional troupes from the Twin Cities would come down on occasion to entertain everyone between Adams, Minnesota and Stacyville, Iowa. The Irish Sodality groups performed plays there. Over the years, the hall also was used for parties, weddings, dances, band performances and church dinners. The dances shook the hall floor so badly in the late 1930s that dances were sometimes moved to bowery floors south of the store. Movies were shown for several years outside on the south wall of the store. The store is well-remembered as the social hub of the entire area.
