Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Booth Post No. 130 G.A.R. Hall is a simple frame building with a facing east on S. Main Street in Grand Meadow. It is just south of the railroad tracks separating the downtown commercial area to the north from a residential area to the south.

The building has a front-facing gable and a projecting gabled front portico. It is faced in 4" wide clapboards, has a very steeply pitched roof, and no basement, but a new concrete block foundation. The over-all effect is simple and functional. Details are few, but include a sill course under the windows, below which is vertical wood sheathing. With the tall roof, the overall effect is reminiscent of the Carpenter Gothic style. The projecting portico has diamond-patterned shingles in the gable and Eastlake style porch columns. The portico has been weather-proofed by enclosing the area around the outer front door. This first door is a modern storm door with glass in the upper portion. The door inside the portico leading to the hall is original. Windows on the front facade are placed in cant corners at the edges of the building. These corners are decorated with scroll-sawn brackets. A band of diamond-patterned shingles forms the frieze.

Integrity of the building is excellent. The roof, originally wood-shingled, is now asphalt shingles. Windows are one-over-one and boarded up with wooden shutters. The interior is intact as built with wood lath and plaster under wallpaper. Walls have wide baseboards and a molded chair rail. The floor is maple. A new sheet rock ceiling was installed at the same time the concrete block foundation and leaking roof shingles were refurbished in 1976 by the Mower County Historical Society to stabilize the building.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The G.A.R. Booth Post #130 Hall is significant on architectural grounds as an excellent intact example of a small pattern-book hall. Similar pattern-book structures, popular in the 19th century and inexpensive to build, were altered or razed, and this hall is an excellent surviving example of its kind. It is remisincent of the Carpenter Gothic style in a small commercial building. Secondarily, it is one of the last two remaining G.A.R. Halls in Minnesota. As such, it represents a fraternal group which organized itself around camaraderie in the Civil War and social service thereafter.

The Booth Post #130 was organized in Grand Meadow in 1885 and named after one of the soldiers of Hamilton, Fillmore County, who died in the Civil War. In 1889, the mothers, wives, and daughters of soldiers organized a Woman's Relief Corps, Booth Corps #62. Their main aim was to aid the suffering and needy. The hall was built after subscriptions yielded \$523 in 1891 and the Women's Relief Corps donated another \$115. The women received the deed to the hall in 1914. They marched in blue uniforms at Memorial Day parades, decorated cemeteries, sewed for the Soldiers Home, and had parties for the veterans at the State Hospital. The building was occupied in the fall of that year.

At the first meeting in the hall, it was unanimously voted that the building never be used for another purpose as long as the post survived. This pledge was kept and the hall was operated until 1961 by the Women's Relief Corps, after all the members of the Booth Post died. It is the only hall in the state to have been used for its original purpose so long. The building stood empty after the last few ageing members of the women's corps disbanded in 1961. In 1975, the Girl Scouts took charge and turned the building into a local museum as a Bicentennial project. The building is now managed by the Mower County Historical Society.
