This is the only lowa barn known to have been directly influenced by the 1910 Illinois Agricultural Experiment Station Bulletin #143. The owner, Henry Frantz, and a local contractor, Beecher Lamb, designed this barn using the round barn plans of the Illinois bulletin. Identifying characteristics include the self-supporting single hip gambrel roof, central silo, and circular interior arrangement. The use of cement blocks rather than wood ballon frame construction is an exception to the Illinois plan.

W.E. Frudden's <u>Farm Buildings</u>: How to <u>Build Them</u> includes a photograph and plans of this barn. It is known from Frudden, and from the 1979 Mail Questionaire, that this was originally a beef cattle barn. Although used as a dairy barn between 1930 and 1970, it is again a beef cattle barn with an open first floor plan and the original concrete manger surrounding the central silo.


