Site of Gail Borden's first condensed milk process plant, the pond was purchased by the state in SIGNIFICANCE 1929 with revenues from fishing licenses. Nothing, save some possible foundations of potential historic industrial archaeological sites, survives from the once-thriving 19th-century industrial enterprises that ringed Burr Pond. The Civilan Conservation Corps Camp Wolcott operated in the forest between 1933 and 1937 to develop Burr Pond as a recreational area. The stone Administration Building is the only structure to survive the camp. It exhibits the same superb masonry and wrought-iron work as well as good design that characterize the finest CCC projects.
