Shade Swamp Shelter

Shade Swamp was acquired by the state for a management area beginning in 1926 with the donation of 140 acres by Walter W. Holmes. The state now owns the entire swamp. During the early years the sanctuary was used to care for injured birds and quadrupeds as well as for some experiments in propagation. That use was discontinued ca. 1938. The facility is underutilized and public use is not encouraged. Despite a lack of maintenance, the shelter survives in a remarkably complete state of preservation.
