A fine example of a center chimney colonial farmhouse, the house is five bays across wi^t ridge to street. Windows are original, 12/12 on the first floor and 12/10 on the second. There are five lights above the split front door. Each door has four molded panels and the doorway is surrounded by plain molding with simple Georgian "ratchets". The date 1774 is designed in the brick of the chimney. There is a single story ell to the rear on the north side and a piazza at the south end wall. A red sandstone retaining wall in front of the house probably indicates where Main Street had been graded and lowered some time in the past.
