## DESCRIPTION

Located at 235 E. Capitol Drive in the Village of Hartland, the Stephen Warren House was constructed in the 1850's for Hartland's first white settler, Stephen Warren. The two story cream brick Greek revival house has an asphalt-shingled hipped roof and is set on a stone foundation. L-shaped in configuration, the house features brick pilasters supporting a wood entablature, and multipaned windows with stone lintels. The main entrance, at one time sheltered by a one story porch, is very plain with a stone lintel over the door. A simple onestory wood entrance porch appears on the west facade. On the rear facade is a non-contributing narrow one-story frame section which may pre-date the main The interior of the house has been extensively remodeled, and the integrity of its site compromised by its location in what is now a mixed commercial and residential area, and by the recently constructed bank which encroaches on the west facade.

## ARCHITECTURAL/ENGINEERING SIGNIFICANCE

The Stephen Warren House is architecturally significant as a good local example of vernacular Greek Revival. Two other such residences survive in Hartland; 526 West Capitol Drive, and 137 North Avenue, both of which exhibit a complete loss of integrity. Despite interior remodeling and compromises to the site, the physical structure of the Warren House retains good exterior integrity, and represents the best preserved vernacular Greek Revival residence in the village, a type of residential architecture which was prevalent in Hartland's early history.

## HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

"I walked from my father's home in Michigan to Milwaukee, arriving there, in the snow, on February 1, 1838. I came on to Prairieville and then April 1st, came to his place, ..." (A)

Warren's 1838 arrival was the culmination of a mission to find a new home for his parents and twelve brothers and sisters. He met them two months later on his way to Prairieville. "On the way I met my father's dog. My heart jumped into my mouth when I saw my brother coming to find me and going on, soon found my parents ... " (A) Settling into his new surroundings quickly, Warren staked his claim to some acreage on the north side of the township line. sold it in 1839 because he felt that the parcel was too isolated, buying instead land south of the line. His new land was between present day Cottonwood and Maple Avenues. (A)

Warren married Miss Mary Nicholson in the community's first wedding in 1840. The Warren's built the captioned property along the Watertown Plank Road, the village's first improved transportationway, in the 1850's.

## HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

This house is deemed historically significant under criterion B for its association with Stephen Warren. It is the last tangible reminder of Hartland's founder.
