DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Milan Post Office is a two-story building of limestone located at 328 South Main Street which is in the downtown business district. The building has housed the city's postal operations since its completion in 1936. The basement is used for mechanical operation of the building and the first floor is the post office. The second floor is office space which is leased to federal agencies and/or private sector tenants.

The front facade consists of five bays reading window-window-door-window-window. The main floor is accessible by a flight of granite steps with cast-iron railings which are flanked by a pair of prominent lanterns. The windows in the front facade have plain stone lintels above double-hung 12/12 lights. There is an elliptical stone arch above the main entrance underneath which is a carved wood eagle and rosette. Columns are planted on the face of the building enclosing the central bay and supporting the arch above the main entrance. There is a limestone lintel with keystone above transom over the doors in the front facade. The front doors are steel with handles of solid bronze.

The public lobby has a wainscot base and border of Tennessee French pink marble and the floor is a light Tennessee gray terrazzo. The composition for all light Tennessee gray terrazzo is pink, gray and white. All terrazzo floors have brass strips. The stair treads and landing leading to the upper level are Tennessee gray terrazzo. The workroom has the original hardwood floors.

Central air conditioning was added to the building in 1965 at which time general repairs were also made. The building has been well maintained, is in good condition, and retains its original character.

Floorplans of the building are included as part of the nomination form.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Montgomery, Alabama

This building, as were most of the buildings constructed during this period, was designed within the office of Louis A. Simon who was Supervising Architect at that time.

The building is a fine example of the simplified Classical Revival design popular for government buildings during the 1930's. It has retained its architectural integrity on the exterior.

The building is significant as a representation of the federal government's efforts to alleviate unemployment during the Depression. An expanded public building program by the federal government during this era helped to stimulate the economy.

An article in Architectural Forum in September 1933 stated the Post Office Department had developed a technique and was constantly improving standardization of plans to fill their needs efficiently and economically. The standard plans allowed for rapid construction and, at the same time, permitted architectural innovation to the treatment of facades which could be adapted to specific localities by the use of native material.

In terms of both its architecture and its long-term identity as a federal facility serving the community, it is my opinion that this building is eligible for inclusion in the National Register on the basis of local significance.

Lying and being in Milan, Gibson County, State of Tennessee, and described as follows:

Beginning at a stake at the southwest corner of said lot in the east margin of the sidewalk along the east side of Main Street and in the north margin of the concrete pavement along Rhodes Street (Towne's Alley) and in a projecting line 3.58 feet South 45 degrees 40 minutes West of the southwest corner of a 6" x 6" concrete marker, Said corner of said marker being 78.6 feet North 77 degrees 45 minutes East from a mark on a corner of the U. S. A. Presbyterian Church and 50.1 feet South 89 degrees 30 minutes West from a corner of the Cumberland Presbyterian brick church building; running thence with the north margin of the concrete paving of Rhodes Street North 45 degrees 40 minutes East 212.58 feet to a stake in a projecting line 6 feet from the southeast corner of a 6" x 6" concrete marker, said stake being in the north margin of the concrete paving of Rhodes Street and in the west margin of the curb along First Street: thence with the inner margin of the curb along First Street North 44 degrees 20 minutes West 98.9 feet to the northeast corner of a concrete 6" x 6" marker, the same being the southeast corner of the Methodist Episcopal South Church Parsonage; thence South 45 degrees 40 minutes West 211.37 feet to a stake in a projecting line 2.37 feet from the northwest corner of a concrete 6" x 6" marker, the same being the southwest corner of the said Parsonage lot and being in the east margin of the sidewalk on the east side of Main Street; thence South 44 degrees 20 minutes East with the east margin of said sidewalk 98.9 feet to the point of beginning, containing 20964.82 square feet.
