DESCRIPTION (Continued)	The off-center gable of the apse contains the main entrance to the church, set in recessed pointed, compound-arched opening. A large quadruple window is centered above the entrance. To the right of the apse, set slightly back, is a massive square tower, highlighted at the top by a traceried, double, pointed-arch window. To the left of the apse, a smaller incomplete tower completes the asymmetrical balance of the facade. This later tower, along with the main tower, displays several smaller rectangular windows, trimmed and keyed into the brick with limestone. The side elevations of the nave have slim buttresses capped with limestone and display a combination of square-headed and pointed arched windows. Set well back from the street and connected to the church by a low, one-story connector is the 1955 brick addition, which is one story in front and three on the rear due to the slope of the lot. It houses the education department and offices.
