DESCRIPTION (Continues) 2 story masonry dwelling, 3 bays wide and 2 bays deep. House has a pitched roof with simple box cornice. Cornice makes a complete return across the gable-ends. East side gable has eliptical window with delicate, leaded glass tracery. Pleasant Street side has symmetrical bays, each with 12 x 12 sash, cut-stone sill and blinds. A center entry on the side has a simple wood frame with paneled entry door with small transom. Transom has leaded glass tracery. Over the entry is a cut-stone lintel. The south side features a 1 story porch, 3 bays long. On the west side is a 1 story ell with pitched roof. Planning Consultant - Town of Windsor Preston Maynard in inspiration. The eliptical gable window and front door transom are holdovers from the Federal period. This house remains beautifully intact at the present time and is an essential element in the mid-19th century neighborhood along Pleasant and East Streets. The house was built by William Shelton in 1830. Brick was obtained from William Macks' Example of a Federal/Greek Revival style transitional dwelling. This house is simply proportioned, with basic box pierced by symmetrical fenestration. However, the detail is beautifully appointed with rich leaded glass windows in the gable and over the entry.
