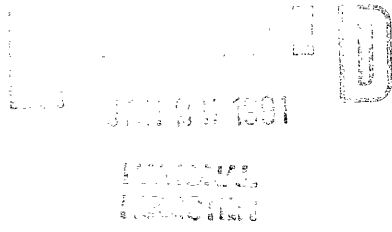

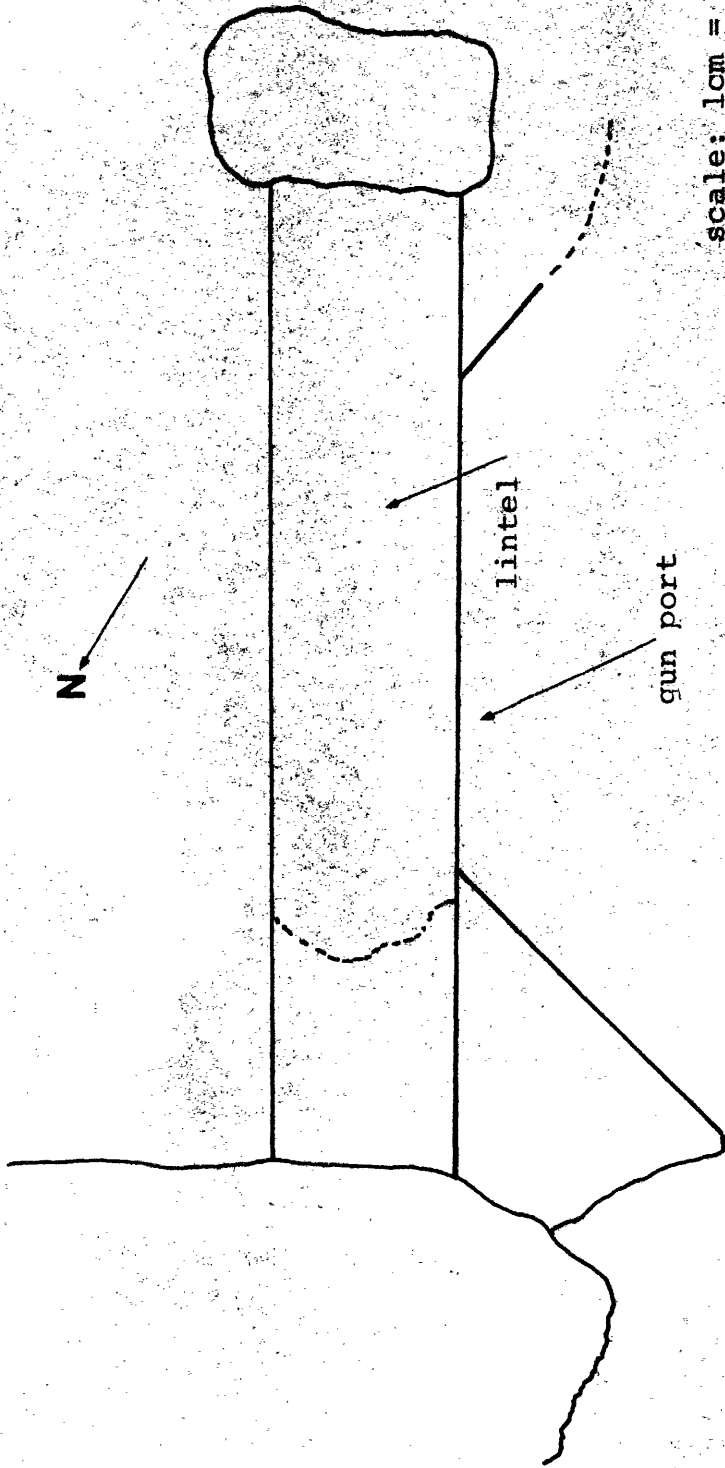

The remains of a pillbox are located on the west side of the limestone cliff of the headland where the Reef Hotel is located. The remains occur next to the stairs leading from the beach to the hotel. The pillbox is situated behind the beach about 10.0m from the high tide line. Built of steel-reinforced concrete, the original shape of the structure is not reconstructable. Only a portion of the gun port remains. The embrasure faces west with a view of the west part of Tumon Bay. The opening of the gun port measures 1.50m wide and 1.36m high. The cement cross beam above the port is .54m thick and .75m wide.

A second cement structure is located about 10.0m to the south of the first. It is 18.0m inland from the high tide line. This feature is built into a niche in the the limestone cliff. Constructed of reinforced concrete, it is also in poor condition. Only a portion of the roof slab, two cement supporting posts, and a secton of the rock-faced wall remain. The original shape of the structure cannot be reconstructed. Steel rebars extrude from the broken edge of the roof which is .31m thick. The sdupporting posts, which are .30m by .30m, extend above present ground surface .63m. the rock wall appears to enclose the north side of the strucutre. The wall is .90m high.
