19. Historical and Architectural Importance (continued):

Clark Brothers Factory #2 embodies the distinctive characteristics of early 20th-century industrial architecture and is especially illustrative of the functional specialization which occurred in the period. In addition to a standard multi-story, general-purpose building (rear of Building A), the complex has well-preserved examples of heatprocess buildings and single-story manufacturing facilities. The high proportions and steel-framed roofs of the heat-process buildings allowed movement of bulk materials and installation of large equipment, such as drop forges, and the monitor roofs allowed light and ventilation of dangerous fumes. The large, broad sawtooth-roofed manufacturing buildings represent an early 20th-century development made possible by steel roof framing. The result was open floor space well-lighted over the whole area by the sawtooth monitors.
