Uncle Will Collins was a member of the church for 70 years and died about 1982 at age 100. Family names in this church were Litteral, Stapleton, Ward, and Stafford. The oldest present member of the church is Edith Stafford, who supplied the above information. This church is a part of the Johnson County Parish and the parsonage for the parish is located There. Before the parish's organization, the church was a part of the Salyersville charge.
