

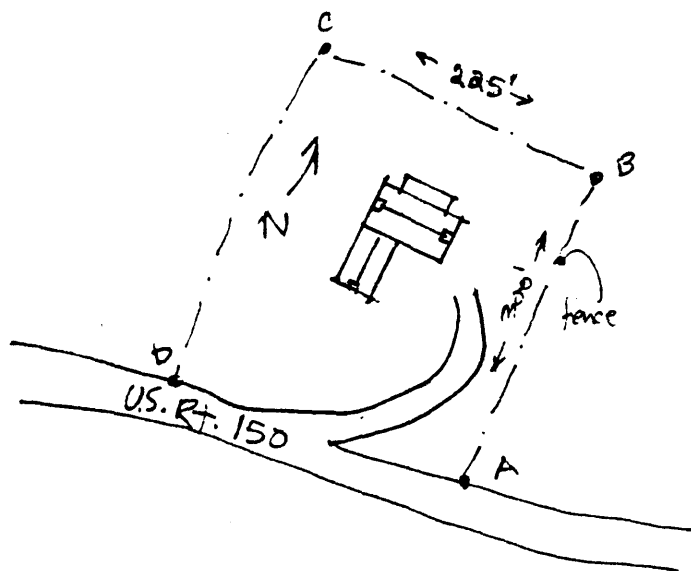

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage less than one acre

Point A is located where a fence intersects with the U.S. 150 right of way approximately 150 feet south-southeast of the Clements House. Beginning at Point A on the north side of U.S. 150, north approximately 300 feet with fence on east side of site to Point B, then 225 feet west with a fence on north of site to Point C south with fence 300 feet to Point D on the north side of U.S. 150, east 225 feet along northside U.S. 150 to point of origin. The boundaries were chosen to encompass the house and domestic-related space enclosed by the highway and fences. No outbuildings are included. The nominated area includes one contributing building.
