Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The David Jones House is a two-story, symmetrical plan, three bay brick, Italianate design residence built in 1874 with a one-story brick ell. The house is of common bond brick construction with a hipped roof of composition shingles, two interior brick chimneys, and a brick foundation. On the main (north) facade is a one-story porch added ca. 1920 with brick piers and a solid brick railing. Above the roof of the porch is a ca. 1920 wood balustrade with square balusters. The central bay of the main facade projects from the main block of the building and contains the main entrance. This entrance has an original six-light glass and frame door and a four light arched transom with brick hood molding. On the second story of the central bay is a doorway leading to the porch roof. This entrance has an original two-light glass and wood door with brick hood molding.

Windows are six-over-six light wood sash with an arched upper sash, brick sills and brick hood molding. Approximately half the windows have original shutters while the remainder are ca. 1960 matching shutters. At the roofline of the central bay is a projecing gable roof with gable returns and an added relief panel with a central shield and lion and unicorn. On the east facade is an original projecting bay window with decorative border glass windows. Other windows on this facade and the west facade are six-over-six light arched sash with label brick hood molding. The rear ell has an original one-story porch on the east facade with chamfered porch posts and ca. 1960 lattice walls. On the west facade of the ell is an original shed roof frame wing.

The interior of the house has not been significantly altered and retains an original staircase with round newel post and balusters. Mantles are of Greek Revival influence with Doric pilasters. The interior retains four panel doors, molded door surrounds, and wood floors. Modern paneling has been added over the plaster walls and some ceilings have added tile. To the east of the house is a ca. 1920, one-story frame, gable roof garage with weatherboard siding. (NC)

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The David Jones House is significant under criteria B and C for its association with noted builder David Jones and as an example of the Italianate style of the 19th century. The house was built in 1874 by David Jones who operated a well known brick manufacturing company and was responsible for the construction of many notable buildings in Maryville. Jones built his residence in the Italianate style with arched windows and doors with label brick hood molding. Jones resided here until 1880 and with the exception of a one-story porch addition of the early 20th century, the residence has not been significantly altered.

David Jones came to America from Wales in 1857 and worked as a mason in New York for ten years. In 1867, Jones moved to Maryville and established a steam sawmill and brickyard and gained a reputation as a master builder. Jones supplied the bricks for the construction of many buildings in these years including the Friends Church in 1871-72. In 1874, Jones purchased this property on High Street and erected a two-story, Italianate influenced residence. While residing at this residence he contracted to build the Blount County Courthouse which was completed in 1879 (burned 1906). Jones is also credited with building a number of residences and commercial buildings in the downtown area during these years which do not survive.

Jones' increasing prosperity resulted in the sale of his High Street house in 1880 and he later built a larger Second Empire style residence on the edge of Maryville in 1887 (NR-1982). Both the Italianate and Second Empire style residences built by Jones are notable examples of design and workmanship. Both properties are important under criterion B for their association with Jones as an important builder and each represents a different period of his significance in the community. Jones also gained fame as builder of the Lamar Memorial Library (1888) and the Fayerweather Science Hall (1898) on the Maryville College Campus. The High Street house was sold in 1880 to W.T. Parham who had served as mayor of Maryville in the 1860s. The Parham family owned the house until 1902 when it was sold to Dr. E.B. Waller, a professor at Maryville College. The Waller family owned the property until the 1950s and it has since had several owners. Alterations to the residence in the 20th century have been confined to the one-story porch addition on the main facade which was added ca. 1920. See continuation sheet


