The R.H. Thomas House is a one-and-one-half-story, central passage plan, five bay I-house with Italianate detailing constructed in 1849. The house is of timber frame construction was built in a rectangular plan. At the rear is a one-story shed roof wing added ca. 1900. The house is sited on a rural lot to the west of the community of Buffalo. To the west of the house is a garage built in 1989.

The house has a stone and brick foundation, gable roof of metal standing seam, weatherboard siding, and interior wall brick chimneys. On the main (north) facade is a one-story entry porch with square columns and milled vergeboard decoration. These columns rest on a ca. 1960 concrete porch foundation and floor. The main entrance has an original four panel door with upper arched panels. Above the door is a four light transom and adjacent three light transoms with arched upper lights. Above the transom is a molded cornice and architrave molding. Flanking the door are original three light sidelights with raised panels and arched upper lights.

Windows are original four-over-four rectangular wood sash with wood sills and projecting cornices. The upper lights are arched and the windows also retain both original and replacement louvered wood shutters. Half-story windows are four-over-four sash with pedimented hoods. In the central gable of the second story is a wood finial.

The interior retains its original floor plan and layout. Original detailing includes Greek Revival influenced mantles, staircase, and four panel doors with two-light transoms.

PROPERTY TYPE: Rural Residence, 1820-1860

The R.H. Thomas House is significant under criterion C as a good example of a mid-19th century Italianate influenced residence. The house was built in 1849 and has not been substantially altered. It is one of the best preserved Italianate influenced residences in the rural sections of the county.

Tradition states that this residence was built in 1849 by R.H. Thomas. Thomas was a farmer who owned several hundred acres of adjacent farmland on the Nolin River. Thomas owned the house until 1868, when it was sold along with 132 acres to James Thomas. Thomas owned the property throughout the late 19th century until it was sold in 1898. The house was then owned by members of the Routt and Spratt families. In 1917, it was purchased by the Druin family and was owned during much of the mid-20th century by the Poore family. Interior restoration has occurred under the direction of the present owners.

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


Verbal Boundary Description: The boundary for the R.H. Thomas House is shown as lot 25 on accompanying Larue County tax map 31.
