Describe present and historic physical appearance.

This is a one-story, brick building with a front gable roof and intersecting side gables. The flat-roofed front porch is supported by three chamfered posts resting on a low wall. There is a similar, though smaller, porch in the el created by intersecting wings on the east side of the house. A rectangular, flat-roofed bay with original long double-hung windows projects from the east-facing gable. At the rear of the house is an adobe addition with a corrugated metal roof. The house is set back from the street with a low masonry wall at the street line.

The house is not without alteration. The brick walls have been painted white and the roof covered with asphalt shingles. With the exception of those in the east-facing bay, the original windows have been replaced with casement windows of reduced size. Original segmental—arched keystone lintels are discernable in low relief above the filled—in sections of the former window openings. A porch in the el of the intersecting gables on the west side has been enclosed. An adobe addition was placed at the rear of the house by Walter Darr in about 1933 after a fire, (Salome, interview).

Despite alterations, the house conveys its historic associations.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

This building is architecturally significant as one of the brick dwellings built on McCutcheon Avenue in the years of Socorro's greatest prosperity. In plan, siting, style, and architectural detail it illustrates the influences brought in by the railroad in the decade of Socorro's mining prosperity.

The earliest documentation of the house is its appearance on the 1893 Sanborn map. The house was purchased by Delphina Eaton from Samuel N. Dedrick of El Paso, Texas, in 1896, (Socorro County Deeds, Bk. 42, p. 4). Delphina Eaton's husband, Nestor Eaton, was the son of Col. Ethan Eaton who had extensive mining and ranching interests and was the leader of the Socorro vigilantes in the early 1880s. Nestor Eaton the fifth of Col. Eaton's eight children was educated in Santa Fe and Arizona and he married Delphina Padilla in 1893. He was associated with his father and brothers in mining enterprises. Active in the Republican party, in 1892 he was elected Socorro county assessor. The Eaton's foster daughter, Gertrude (born 1894), and her husband, Walter S. Darr, Sr. moved into the house in the late 1920s, (Salome, interview). Walter Darr was a prominent Socorroan who in the 1920s served as county sheriff and water master. The Darrs obtained title to the property in 1940. It was inherited by the present owner, Evelyn Darr Salome. The house was placed on the New Mexico State Register of Cultural Properties on March 20, 1978 as the Eaton/Darr House.

The Period of Significance, c. 1893, the approximate building date based on the earliest documentation on the Sanborn maps.
