Describe present and historic physical appearance.		

The Megginson House sits on a 50 by 140 foot lot in the Florence Place Subdivision. The landscaping is informal. The house itself is a one story, stucco, 3x5 bay Spanish Revival structure. It has a flat parapeted roof with coping and grouped casement windows. An attached shed roof porch with ceramic tile covers the facade and wraps around the north elevation. The porch features a series of open arches, with the entrance arch somewhat narrower. The porch retains its original tile pavers. Iron railings connect the arches. There is a bay window at the north elevation.

The interior features an irregular plan with hardwood floors, stucco walls, interior transoms, fireplace and arches. The living room features the fireplace and shelves against the south wall and an open arch into the dining room with an iron floor grate. The bay window on the north elevation features an arched entrance as does the kitchen immediately west. The kitchen retains its original cabinets and the bath features the original tile floor.

Integrity

The Megginson House retains its integrity of location, style and design. There are no significant interior or exterior alterations.

CRITERION C: ARCHITECTURE

The Megginson House is significant under National Register Criterion C as a typical middle class expression of the Spanish Revival style. Built in one of Mobile's developing suburbs in 1927, the house exhibits classic elements of the style including stucco construction, ceramic tile roof and an elegant interplay of interior and exterior arches.

Florence Place was platted in 1926 by George Fearn and Son. Early attempts to require an all Spanish Revival neighborhood were defeated by the Depression. 143 Florence Place, perhaps one of the most elegantly styled Spanish Revival houses in Mobile, was built in 1927 by Ernest Megginson, a druggist. In 1928 the house was valued at over \$6000. It remains in good condition.
