

Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Located 7.8 miles southwest of Valentine, the Adamson Bridge spans the Niobrara River in a rural Cherry County setting that has changed little since the structure's period of significance. Other than maintenance-related repairs, the bridge remains essentially unaltered as it continues to carry vehicular traffic. The Adamson Bridge today retains a high degree of integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling and association. A description of the structure follows:

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations and areas of significance noted above.

After the moving winter ice pack destroyed or damaged some 21 Niobrara River bridges in Cherry County in February 1916, the county commissioners declared an emergency and established a special fund to pay for the extensive repair and reconstruction. One of the bridges wrecked by the flood was the Adamson Bridge, a 100-foot steel truss erected in 1910-11 by the Canton Bridge Company. Located near the Tioga Post Office southwest of Valentine, this structure was the first visited by the commissioners on February 29th. After conferring with a representative from the Canton Bridge Company, they ordered the contractor to build a new timber structure approximately 200 feet downriver from the previous span here. The timber stringer structure that stands today is apparently the same bridge that Canton built that year. Although it seems improbable that the existing structure dates from 1916 (wood construction typically falls prey to deterioration from a variety of sources), neither county nor state records give any indication that a new bridge was ever built to replace the 1916 span. The roadway has been widened by adding steel piles and timber stringers on the west side, the guardrails have been replaced with Armco and the timber deck has been thinly coated with asphalt, but the Adamson Bridge remains otherwise intact, with a high degree of physical integrity.

Although Nebraska's counties used timber extensively for bridge construction in the early 1900s, nearly all of these simple pile bridges have since been replaced, due in large part to the impermanent nature of wood. The Adamson Bridge is a notable exception. Because of the relatively light traffic it carries, it has apparently survived with only minor structural alterations. The Adamson Bridge is technologically significant as one of the few remaining examples in the state of early timber bridge construction.
