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St. Matthew's by the Bridge Episcopal Church Hardin County, Iowa

Description:

St. Matthew's by the Bridge is a single story rectangular building measuring 24'x 60' perched on the palisade overlooking the Iowa River next to the Oak Street bridge. It features a gable roof, with two entrances located on the long, or eave, side (the north elevation). The primary entrance is that at the northwest corner. Tudor Revival in design, the building is of wood frame construction covered with stucco. The gable ends have a simple simulated half-timbered effect and paneled vergeboards. Diagonal braces appear to support the roof. A cross is located atop the south gable end, and the gable of both entrances. A single chimney is located just to the east of the eastern entry. Windows were all originally of small leaded diamond shaped panes. Five memorial stained glass windows have been placed in the sanctuary in recent years ("Ascension" over the altar in 1965, and the four Apostles on the south and west walls between 1980 and 1987).

A single story wing with shed roof was added at the rear basement level approximately thirty years ago. This addition was needed to provide a vicar's study, class rooms, and storage space and is not considered to be intrusive. The exterior is stuccoed to match the rest of the building, and it can only be seen from the east and west ends. The south elevation along the river bank is hidden by trees most of the year.

On the interior, St. Matthew's remains basically unchanged. The altar is located at the east end of the sanctuary. The organ was moved several years ago, into a portion of the choir area on the north side. The aisle is arranged just to the left of center, with narrow pews along the north wall. The walls are plastered, while the ceiling is of wood. The interior structural system of King-posts, Queen-posts, collar beams, and struts makes a dramatic vertical statement. Wood throughout the interior has been given a deep stain, creating a sharp contrast of light and dark. The feeling of the sanctuary is that of a small, intimate place of worship.

The lower level is given over to offices, classrooms, and a kitchen and is not considered to be significant.





Shaded buildings are those being nominated.



Significance:

St. Matthew's by the Bridge (1913) is locally significant under Criterion C and meets Criterion Consideration A as a good example of a small Tudor Revival design church. The period of significance is the year of construction.

Tudor Revival, as a style, was very popular during the early part of the 20th century and was commonly used for residences, offices, and school buildings as well as churches. The majority of these Tudor inspired buildings were architect designed. St. Matthew's by the Bridge is an exception. Robert Layton was an industrial arts teacher in the Iowa Falls school system. An Englishman, Layton returned to his old home on a visit in 1912, and made sketches of several village churches in the area. Armed with these sketches he drew the plans from which St. Matthew's was built the following year. Two of his students, Louis and Ernie Weldon, assisted him in making the blueprints.

St. Matthew's by the Bridge (fondly referred to by its parishioners as "St. Matthew's on the Brink" because of its precipitous location) retains a strong quality of the small English churches. There is no attempt at grandeur. It is a quiet, simplified example of the Tudor style, with little half-timbering, and no fancy designs on the vergeboards. There is an intimacy of scale and proportion, a warmth of materials, that create a very inviting space.

This church was built on lots purchased a few years earlier, about the time that the first Oak Street bridge was built, connecting both sides of the river in this part of town. With the coming of the automobile and paving, this site became a prime one for construction. The Oak Street bridge channeled the traffic on U.S. Highway 65 into downtown Iowa Falls. St. Matthew's was well located to serve people from both parts of the community.
