7. Description

The former Cottage Bakery is a one-story building with a front and rear section. The front section consists of an asphalt shingle pitched roof, a white painted brick walls, and a concrete foundation. The building's unusually low facade reflects a modest use of picturesque elements associated with the Thatched Cottage Style. Brown asphalt shingles wrap around the eaves and the slight eyebrow arches in the roof that mark the entries near each end of the facade to simulate a thatched roof. Segmented brick arches outline two arched doors leading to the two separate sections of the building. One door is wood with a large single light; the other is wood batten with a small horizontal light. An exterior chimney is located at the east gable. The front and west side of the building have large, multi-light metal casement windows wrapping around the corner and continue on the end walls.

In contrast, the rear portion that served as the bakery's processing and shipping plant is utilitarian with a basement, flat roof and white and brown painted brick and cinder block walls. Although most of the bays and windows have been closed and boarded, three block glass and several small metal casement windows remain. A wood panel door on the east side marks the entry to the playhouse that now occupies most of the rear portion. The front of the rear portion is integrated into the restaurant that occupies the eastern half of the front portion. The fireplace in the restaurant has a plain tile hearth and wood mantel and is one of the few remaining interior elements

The building fronts Central Avenue at the end of a narrow block and has no off-street parking. In recent years the Thatched Cottage Style front portion has served as a hair salon as well as a restaurant with both businesses using the gable ends and front facade for advertising signs. A small concrete block shed-roof entry has been added at the east side. These changes have done little, however, to alter the original appearance of the building.

8. Statement of Significance

The Cottage Bakery building is one of the last remaining largely unaltered structures associated with the pre-war period of roadside food outlets along Route 66. With the realignment of Route 66 anticipated during the years preceding its completion in 1937 and with Albuquerque's suburban development creeping up onto the East Mesa, the Cottage Bakery was one of several cafes and food outlets appearing along Central Avenue in the mid-1930s. The bakery, on the east side, offered baked goods; and the Spot Ice Cream Co., on the west side, offered "Fountain and curb surface" to local residents and to motorists travelling the highway. Because of this association with automobile tourism along Route 66, the property is eligible under Criterion A.

Its unique use of the Thatched Cottage Style also qualifies the building under Criterion C as one of the few examples of roadside businesses along Route 66 in New Mexico that relied on a "duck" style to alert passing motorists of the building's function. The implicit message conveyed by the Cottage Pure Company through its use of the medieval-looking structure was one of a bucolic purity that clients would associate with dairy and bakery products. Behind this "duck" facade was the utilitarian portion of the building. When it opened, the baking plant was celebrated for its modern ovens and mixing machines as well as its employee facilities including showers and individual lockers.
