

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**Description** The Col. Robert A. Smith Monument is a limestone shaft approximately 25 feet tall. The shaft is located just east of the CSX railroad track and just south of the bridge over the Green River. The shaft is of rough hewn limestone save for an inscription on the north side. The inscription reads: "South 42 degrees west ninety poles distant is the place of sacrifice of Col. Rob't A. Smith and his regiment the tenth Mississippi on sept. 14, 1862." A cast iron fence encloses an area of some 250 square feet surrounding the monument. There are six marble markers to the 10th, 44th, 7th, 29th and 9th Mississippi Infantry Regiments just west of the shaft.

**Statement of Significance** The Col. Robert A. Smith Monument meets National Register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected in 1884 by the brother of Col. Robert Smith. The monument was erected to honor his brother's memory and those men under his command. Several soldiers were reinterred within area that surrounds the monument. This is a good example of property type "shaft or obelisk."

**Verbal Boundary Description** - The Col. Robert A. Smith Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of 60 feet centered on the monument located just east of the CSX railroad track and just south of the bridge over the Green River, near Woodsonville, Kentucky.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
