

7. Description

The Hilltop Lodge consists of a one-story building with a flat roof, white cement-stucco walls, and a concrete foundation. It has an L-plan with the manager's office and residence at the front northeast portion of the building and two single and one double garage interspersed among the lodging units. A decorative stepped parapet above the cutout office porch and a continuous parapet lining the entire building suggest a modest use of Southwest Vernacular Style details. These elements together with the spatial organization of the property and its signage give the lodge a strong feeling of a family-run tourist court along Route 66 dating to the 1940s.

The twelve-unit motel has an L-plan that wraps around a courtyard/parking. At the front of the building is an office with a cutoff porch supported by a metal post. The manager's residence extends beyond the line of the lodging units and was added in the late 1940s to permit the owner to reside on the property. The manager's addition has metal casement windows with a nine-light wood frame door, and the lodging units have d/d double-hung wood sash windows. A wide curb cut permits access to the property. Lining the street and perpendicular to it are two neon signs attached to a metal post. The lower sign is topped by the likeness of a snow-capped mountain and announces "air-conditioned" rooms. Changes to the property are minimal and include the addition of vertical board doors to the three garages.

8. Statement of Significance

The Hilltop Lodge is one of the best examples of a largely unaltered tourist court remaining along Route 66 in New Mexico. Constructed incrementally, as was common of small owner-operator tourist courts as discussed in the Multiple Property listing, the Hilltop Lodge began as a three unit residence for single men in

Significance (continued)

1941. In 1946, the owner E.H. Stopple completed the L-plan, hoping to take advantage of the increased tourism along Central Avenue. Shortly thereafter, a manager's residence and a new office were added. Because of this close association with the golden era of tourism along Route 66, the property is eligible under Criterion A. The property also qualifies under Criterion C for the way in which its setting, location, design and materials reflect early tourist court construction in New Mexico. In particular, the garage/lodging unit pattern, the spatial arrangement of the motel, office/residential and patio elements, and the continued use of early signage convey the historic significance of the property.
