
Spur road from monument wall to U.S.Highway No. 87, to thee south. The highway as shown and the spur road is on the original Bozeman Trail.

No record of when this irrigation line was built, but it was an active irrigation line at the time the Fetterman Monument was erected in 1908.





1. Fetterman Battlefield Monument 2. Approximately where a north spur road could be started.






