

Description The John B. Castleman Monument is a two part monument that consists of an equestrian statue and a granite base. It is approximately 15 feet tall, the base is twelve feet by 20 feet. The monument depicts Castleman in civilian clothes riding an American Saddlebred mare. On the base is a bronze plaque with the inscription: "Erected in Honor of John Breckinridge Castleman - Born June 30, 1841 - Died May 23, 1918 - By friends who loved and respected him as a noble patriot, a gallant soldier, a useful citizen -- Major Gen. C.S.A. retired Brigadier Gen., USA."

Statement of Significance The John B. Castleman Monument meets National register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected in 1913 to honor John Breckinridge Castleman, who served in the Confederate army and after the war fought in the Spanish-American War. The Monument is located near Cherokee Park in a very affluent part of Louisville. It was erected as a tribute to Castleman. After his death a plaque was added to the monument that reads: "Erected in Honor of John Breckinridge Castleman - Born June 30, 1841 - Died May 23, 1918 - By friends who loved and respected him as a noble patriot, a gallant soldier, a useful citizen -- Major Gen. C.S.A. retired Brigadier Gen. , USA." Castleman's service in the Confederate army was an important part of his life and career. The monument is also an excellent example of the property type "statue." It is also only one of two equestrian Civil War monuments.

Verbal Boundary Description - The monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of 30 feet centered on the monument located in a median at the intersection of Cherokee Road and Cherokee Parkway.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
