

44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):



The boundary, a roughly 200' square marked by the points A, B, C, and D, includes the house and all outbuildings and sufficient acreage to provide a setting. The boundary B-C is on the north side of KY 20.

Beginning at the point where the east property line intersects with Petersburg Road (B), proceed west 200' (C). Then proceed north 200' (D), turning east 200' (A). Then proceed 200' south to the point of origin.

Contributing: 2 buildings (house, caretaker's house) 1 structure (gazebo) Noncontributing: 1 building (garage)

45. Description and House Plan:

The <u>house</u> is simple in form: a double pile of rooms beneath a broad gabled roof. The small front porch and a generous L-shaped porch extending the full length of the rear (north) and most of the east end of the house are original to the house; this shed-roofed wraparound porch has been enclosed for most of its length and screened-in at the end of the house. Although the house has been vinyl-sided, care was taken to leave all the wooden architectural detailing in place, including the fleur-de-lis bargeboards around both porches, the modillion cornice, and the transom-sidelight unit surrounding the front door; because of the extensive wooden ornament, the vinyl siding is less noticeable than in a simpler house.

The plan, unexpectedly, consists of a central passage flanked by two rooms at the front of the house, and, behind, a suite of three rooms, the central room containing an enclosed corner staircase leading to the upper half-story. The only alteration to the plan is the removal, about the mid-20th century, of the partition wall between the central passage and the room to the right. The simple interior woodwork features Greek Revival-style mantels.

The only remaining outbuildings are a gazebo and caretaker's/servant's house, both likely contemporary with the house, and a later garage. The <u>gazebo</u> is a hexagon covered in clapboard with a asphalt shingle hipped roof. The <u>caretaker's/servant's house</u> is a one room clapboard with an asphalt shingle, gabled roof and bargeboard ornamentation.

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
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
