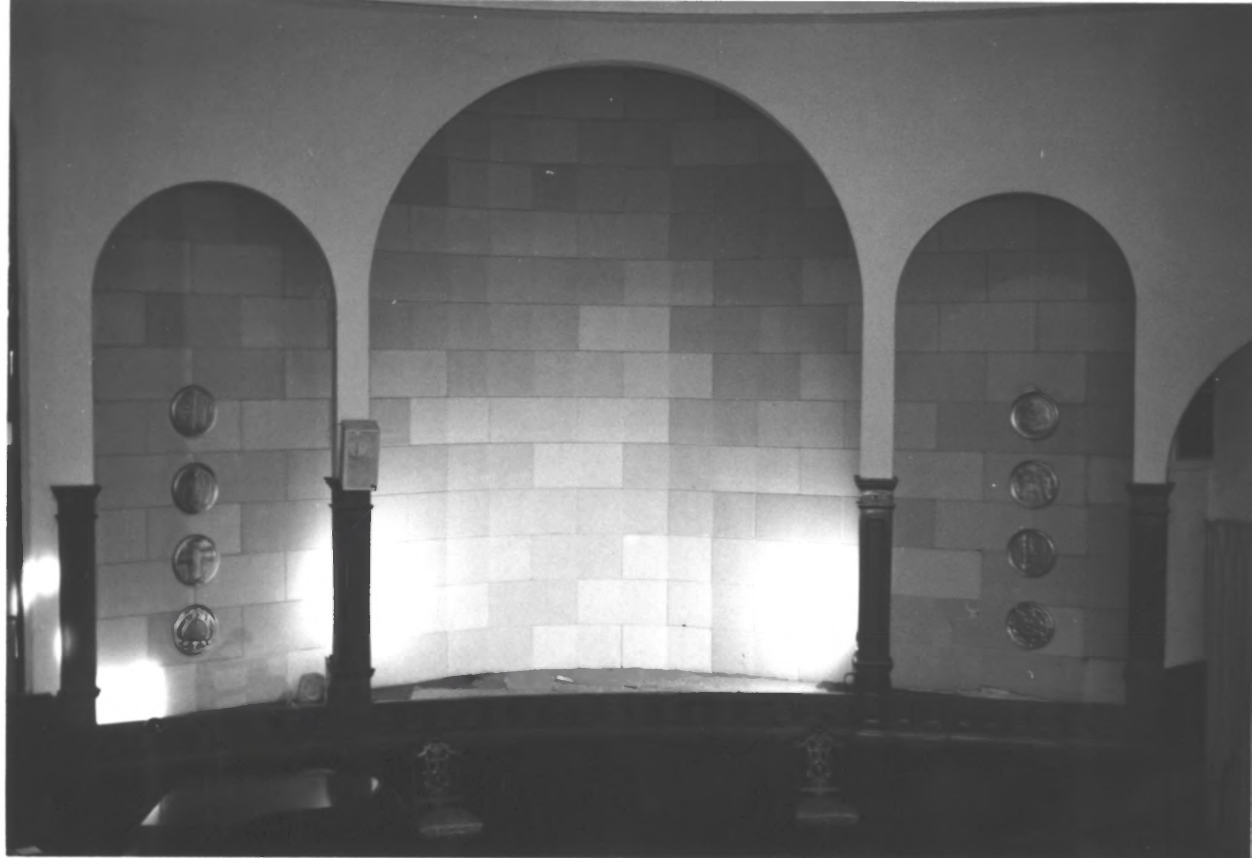

We give herewith a cut of the church in which the Coast Conference of Unitarians has been meeting. This church is a monument to the faithful and untiring labors of Rev. N. A. Haskell, now of Denver. He gathered together a few of those in sympathy with liberal religion about seven years ago and began service in Odd Fellows Hall. His sermons were scholarly and increasingly eloquent and effective. His spirit was Christly and his purpose fixed. He reached out more and more among all classes, especially those who were cultured and who were aggressive in their thinking. The result was that he soon had a congregation of refined and well-to-do people and began the work of erecting an edifice for public service. The present artistic and in every way admirable building is due to his leadership and the strong hands which worked with him. This church property cost about \$31,000 and is almost ideal in every particular. The auditorium, the parlors, the study, the dining and cooking apartments, the location, all are wellnigh perfect in their excellent adaptation to the uses for which they were designed.
