Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Cassia County Courthouse is a detached, rectangular public building. building has an inset central entry bay that is three stories tall. of this tower-like section is a three-bay two-story wing. The entire building sits on a raised basement story. The concrete structure of the building is veneered with red brick laid in common bond. The foundation is concrete; the roof Cream-colored terra cotta cast with foliate and geometric designs decorates many parts of the building: the tops of outset brick pilasters that demark the vertical bays, a capping course that runs the full perimeter of the building, the entry surround, and two inset panels above the entrance. uppermost of these panels carries the legend "Cassia County" in a pale aqua glaze. The second panel has a bold geometric bas relief in the same color. relief terra cotta around the doorway itself has a wingspread eagle and the date Brickwork is used decoratively throughout the building. "1939 basketweave bond surrounds the terra cotta panels on the entry bay. soldier rows form lintels above the windows. In several of the window bays, the area between second and first story windows is filled with a pattern of Either side of the entry are Art Deco lamps. alternating outset stretcher rows. The tower-like entry bay, with its terra cotta panels, and the use of round windows in the second and sixth bays of the front elevation place the building in the Art Deco style popular locally and used for several southeast and south central Idaho public buildings.

All but one of the round windows have been replaced with metal sash windows. Also, replacing the original entry doors are double metal-frame doors. While the loss of original windows and doors has some effect on the building's integrity, the remaining original fabric conveys the important characteristics of the Art Deco style, and the building conveys a sense of the period in which it was built as a part of the WPA in Idaho.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Cassia County Courthouse is significant under criterion "A" in the context of the development of county government as supported by WPA and PWA monies throughout the Depression years. The building is significant under criterion "C" in the context of the architecture of Idaho's county courthouses and as a local example of institutional architecture. The building retains its original monumental massing and most of its Art Deco style features, including its brick veneer, terra cotta detailing, and seven-bay front. The remaining original fabric conveys the important characteristics of Art Deco style, and the building conveys a sense of the period in which it was built as a WPA project.

Because the building is part of a finite and endangered group of resources associated with the WPA in Idaho and because it is associated with a relief program that had exceptional impact on the Idaho landscape and economy during the Depression years, the building is presented for nomination before it reaches the 50 year mark.

Cassia County received substantial support for construction of its new courthouse in 1938, when the WPA regional office in Portland, Oregon, allotted a \$53,182 grant toward construction of a courthouse estimated to cost \$118,182. Burton E. Morse, Twin Falls architect, was hired in June, 1938, to design the building, replacing a Mr. Fisher of Idaho Falls. The building permit was filed in December, 1938, and construction was completed in the fall of 1939. Boise contractor C.W. Watkins was general contractor for construction.

The new courthouse provided much-needed space for county offices and benefitted the city of Burley by freeing space in the city hall, where the county had leased office space for twenty years. Organized in 1879, Cassia County is one of Idaho's early counties, but the 1939 building was its first monumental courthouse building

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providing adequate facilities for county business. Previous to 1919, when the county seat was moved to Burley, county offices were housed in a frame building at Albion. The 1939 building provided room for the county agent's office, the WPA sewing room, the public assistance office, regular county offices and records vaults, courtrooms, judges' offices, the sheriff's office, and the county jail.

Like most of Idaho's county courthouses, the Cassia courthouse is among the most ambitious and stylistically elaborate architectural designs in its locality and its region and deserves National Register listing on that basis as well as for its contribution to our understanding of the range of architectural designs used for courthouses in Idaho.
