#### Narrative Description

Methodist Church of Alberton

The Methodist Church of Alberton is a one-story gable-fronted building. The plan is simple, rectangular and symmetrical, with a central entrance in the gable front and a square tower above the front, northeast corner. The entrance is sheltered by a gable overdoor, with posts and solid railing on a concrete stoop. There is also a side entry vestibule to the west, accessing the basement. The church is clad with beveled clapboard and illuminated with regularly-spaced double-hung windows with orange translucent glass. The foundation is of cinderblock and houses 6-light casement windows at that level.

The roof is a moderate gable, covered with corrugated metal roofing. It is accentuated by projecting eaves which reveal knee bracing to the front, and exposed rafter ends. The square belfry is sided with wood shingles and louvered vents. It is capped with a pyramidal roof. At the rear, a one-story shed with vertical wood walls was attached.

#### Integrity

The historic integrity of this property has been retained due to the survival of original design and materials, and continuity of use, setting and location. The only alteration to the structure may be replacement of the gable cover over the entrance stoop which likely closely resembles the original treatment, and the awning that has been built over the steps to the basement of the building on the west facade.

#### Narrative Statement of Significance

The Methodist Church is eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, fpr ots architectural values according to Criterion C. This simple wood frame church building exhibits the design and construction characteristics typical of historic churches of the Methodist denomination in Montana. The basic rectilinear form of the building, with single double-hung windows set in a regular pattern along the two side walls, typifies early meeting halls. The construction of the square bell tower on the side of the roof was commonly used by Methodist church congregations to both indicate the religious function of the building and signal the denominational affiliation. Catholics, Lutherans, Baptists and Congregationalists most often centered the bell tower over the central entrance. The Methodist Church accurately recalls the early period of settlement and community development in Alberton and has been in active use since its construction.

This church, built by the Methodist congregation in approximately 1912, is one of two churches established in Alberton during the historic period. Although it is principally a religious property as defined by Criteria Consideration A, its eligiblity rests with its architectural attributes, and thus it meets requirements for listing.
