## Recent Midwest Successes

### Philip Community Trail Project

In 2012 and 2013, NPS staff assisted the community of Philip, South Dakota with a new trail project. Bringing community members together during three community engagement sessions, NPS staff facilitated the development of a four-phase trail plan. The four phases connect community assets, create safer environments for alternative transportation users, and accent the Bad River.

Phase one of the project involved a one-mile loop trail circling the Haakon-Jackson County fairgrounds, the Philip Pool, and a playground. With help from the Central South Dakota **Economic Enhancement** District (CSDEED), the city applied for a South Dakota Department of Transportation **Transportation Alternatives** Program grant. The trail recieved \$51,797 to complete the portion of trail "NPS staff are always looking for new project partners to help communities achieve on the ground results in areas of recreation and natural resource restoration."
