Recent Successes SCA-Manchester Crews Aid NH Trails

Two New Hampshire RTCA projects benefited from NH youth's work in the summer of 2012. Ten NH high school students gave their strength, time, and talents to two projects in the Granite State through Student Conservation Association's (SCA) New

"The energy and joie-de-vive that the teenagers brought boosted the spirits of all the trail volunteers...Besides getting our first section of trail built, they energized the Pathway Team," Hampshire-specific high school trail crews.

On the Newfound Pathway, an SCA crew built the first section of a 17-mile trail that will eventually go around Newfound Lake. On the Quabbin to Cardigan Trail, the SCA crew worked on two different sites: the Lincoln Trail in Rollins State Park on Mt. Kearsarge and the Society for the Protection of NH's Forests' Reney Memorial Forest.

Current Projects

1. Connecticut River Paddlers' Trail

Project Partner: VT Rivers Conservancy NPS Contact: Lelia Mellen Location: Connecticut and White Rivers Congressional District: NH - 2

Project Goal

A network of 20 conservation organizations working towards shared trail stewardship, complementing the CT River AGO National Blueway.

NPS Role

Help to develop a stewardship fund; assist with marketing, funding, community outreach, and specific access projects; launch a trail map; and organize a volunteer steward program.

2. Granite State Rail Trail

Project Partner: NH Rail Trail Coalition NPS Contact: Lelia Mellen Location: Merrimack, Hillsborough, Rockingham, and Grafton Counties Congressional Districts: NH - 1, 2

Project Goal

A 110-mile rail-trail from MA to VT linking existing trails from Salem through Londonderry; and a new trail from Hooksett to Concord that connects with the Northern Rail Trail.

NPS Role

Assist with the completion of missing trail links; complete a marketing strategy.

3. Quabbin-Cardigan Trail

Project Partner: Society for the Protection of NH Forests and AMC NPS Contact: Lelia Mellen Location: Cheshire, Grafton, Hillsborough, Merrimack, and Sullivan Counties Congressional Districts: NH - 1, 2

Project Goal

A completed trail plan, with community endorsement, for an 80mile trail in the NH portion of the Quabbin to Cardigan region.

NPS Role

Work with the communities and trail groups to develop a strategy and management plan for the trail.

4. Souhegan River Walk

Project Partner: Town of Merrimack Town Center Committee NPS Contact: Lelia Mellen Location: Merrimack County Congressional District: NH - 1

Project Goal

Develop a 4.5-mile walking trail system along the Souhegan, connecting many town amenities and re-connecting the town to its historic river.

NPS Role

Assist with coordinating potential partners to protect several parcels; design and construct the trail across an old dam sluiceway and along the river.

5. Upper Valley HS Trail Corps

Project Partner: Upper Valley Trails Alliance (UVTA) NPS Contact: Lelia Mellen Location: Upper Valley towns in NH, VT Congressional District: NH -2

Project Goal

Create a local High School Trail Corps in the Upper Valley region. The Corps will work on no fewer than 5 local trails, learning about the natural world, teamwork, and assisting UVTA in programming youth trail projects.

NPS Role

Help refine programmatic vision, bring local partners and schools to the table, share examples of similar programs, provide leveraging ideas, assist in creating a sustainable corps.
