Recent Successes

Ester Dome Singletrack Project

Thanks to a partnership between Alaska Trails, Goldstream Sports, RTCA, and many others, Alaska's mountain bikers now have a new 10-mile system of singletrack loops to ride. The loop system, located on Ester Dome near Fairbanks, includes a smaller, hand-built, tight and technical inner loop, as well as a number of outer loops constructed with mini-mechanized trail equipment under contract with Happy Trails Incorporated.

trail care crew training in Fairbanks. Currently, RTCA is wrapping up the GPS trail easement diagram that's needed for Alaska Trails to obtain a legal easement from the Alaska Department of Natural Resources for the trail on state land.

1 Alaska Trails Sustainable Trail Training

Alaska (Statewide) Partners: Alaska Trails RTCA Contact: Lisa Holzapfel

Project Goal: Educate Alaskans statewide in sustainable trail planning, design, and construction techniques.

RTCA Role: Help coordinate and teach course modules in both bush Alaska and along the railbelt.

2. Tununak-Toksook Bay ATV Trail Crew Training

Tununak-Toksook Bay, Alaska Partners: Native Village of Tununak, the Western Federal Lands Highway Division, the Denali Commission RTCA Contact: Lisa Holzapfel

Project Goal: Develop a single defined, low-maintenance, 5-mile ATV trail between Tununak and Toksook Bay that minimizes environmental impacts and improves motorized and non-motorized transportation to the regional health clinic, the airport, and to recreational opportunities and subsistence resources.

RTCA Role: Assist the team with review of porous pavement material choices and logistics; help the village select the proper trail location; provide guidance for on-the-ground ATV trail installation methods and village trail

Project Goal: Construct the new Mastodon hiking trail to provide safe, sustainable, year-round access to the Nugget Creek Cabin.

RTCA Role: Assist trail crew in preliminary trail flagging, layout of turns, and assist in evaluation of trail construction methods.

Project Goal: Develop and maintain a trail system that allows for optimum outdoor recreational use of the area while protecting the natural and cultural resources of the park.

RTCA Role: Assist in developing a trail management plan that engages local residents and the general public in the process; provide recommendations for trail management and design (including field reconnaisance and conceptual trail layout); and identify funding sources.

7. Fairbanks Lion's Club Bike Skills and Pump Park
