Project Goal

Establish approximately eight miles of the initial blueway segments of the Dog River Blueway. The project will also produce a map showing greenways, landmarks, boat launches, fishing piers, and parks along the Dog River to promote healthy activity for residents and environmental awareness.

Continuing into its second year, RTCA will continue to assist in the planning process of the project coordinators and public outreach to promote trail use.
