We have forwarded per Deep Minnesota
as per bill annexed including six boxes Glass per
S. W. Underhill, for which they would make no deduction
for cart; they were therefore placed to your credit by them -
8^d cut nails were not to be found in market with any of
the dealers excepting Bussey Brothers and they only had
6 kegs - and as their price is over what you usually pay we
have sent you but two there - Connecticut map I had more
not to be had at any price - but it is presumed that they will be
in market soon. I am you were here we have recd a sum of
38 bcs Hunt's & 44 D Lees brand Flour - we have retailed 21 of
Hunt's at \$5. balance \$6 7/8 and the Lees \$4 3/8 - Also on 29th 40 bcs
Hunt's brand & 14 of which have been sold at 38 and the balance
at 37 1/6 (one excellent sale). There arrived this morning 23 of Hunt's &
75 of Lees brand, the former was sold at \$4 3/8 - and as the latter
is the best which you have sent us, it is uncertain what
it will bring - as the best brands are offered at \$4 3/8 -
As the weather is extremely hot and no prospect of our immu-
ediate improvement you may do better by keeping it
back for the present
