The County Road Bridge was originally built in 1905 without a cover. The cover was constructed in 1908. It was soon necessary to support the bridge with several cables because of the extra wind stresses on the cover.

In later years a concrete shear support was placed on the upstream side of the center pier and shear piling were placed along each upstream bank. Barriers were placed to divert logs and other debris from the piers at both ends and in the center. Serious accumulations of debris have caused severe damage to center pier on several occasions in the past.

Outside of the cables and concrete referred to above, construction is of wood.





the roof, sidewalls, abutments, and pilings of the bridge in June 1976. A total of \$9,976.00 was spent on the project.

Although the covered bridge was once a common means of extending the short life span of timber structures, there are only four covered bridges remaining in Washington. The Grays River Bridge is the oldest of the covered bridges in the State, and the only one that remains part of a public highway.
