DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (11 known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Little is known of the original appearance of Fort Soledad concerning its size, shape, and features. A brief description of the fort is in a 1927 issue of the <u>Guam Observer</u>. At that time its appearance as described is closely identical to its present appearance with the only chance being repairs to the stone sentry box which was made by the parish priest in 1952

The fort proper is located on the seaward corner of a bluff on the southern edge of Umatac Bay. It presently consists of a terrace of flagged coral limestone blocks partially encircled by a low manposteria wall four to five feet thick and one and a half feet high. At the bayside of the terrace is a stone sentry box. On the opposite side of the terrace, but on a lower level, are the walls, now in ruins, built of manposteria of the guards' quarters. The walls stand up to nine feet high to reach the level of the terrace.
