Genoa is an unincorporated community of 115 persons, situated on the west side of Carson Valley, at the foot of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, at an elevation of 4,786 feet m.s.1.

It may be further described as a rural community, with tree shaded gravel streets laid out in an irregular manner. A replica of the old Mormon Station, with its log cabin and timber palisade stockade, old Courthouse across the road, dominate the center of the community.

Several disasterous fires have somewhat altered earlier appearances, but basically, Genoa has changed little in character down through the years.

Genoa has a growing fringe of residential housing on large lots. The town core contains some remnants of the original town center plus open space where business buildings once stood. The Masonic Hall (1858), Genoa Bar (1865), Town Hall (1920's), Firehouse (1971), the store gast pump (1971), and Courthouse (1865) dominate the business center.

The architectural character of Genoa shows a strong Victorian influence. The principal construction material is wood, with a slight intermixture of brick and stone.

*"A seasonal trading post was first established at what is now Genoa by H. S. Beattie in 1850 to do business with the immigrants from the Carson branch of the California Emigrant Trail. In the spring of 1851, about 20 Salt Lake City businessmen, including a man named John Reese, built a trading station at the site, which also became one of Woodward and Chopenning's Overland Mail Stations. These men constructed a log cabin and a stockade. The original name of the post was 'Mormon Station'.

In 1854, Brigham Young, Governor of the Utah Territory, which Nevada was then a part, created a government for western Utah (Nevada). Orson Hyde, a prominent Mormon, was appointed Probate Judge to organize Carson County. Hyde renamed Mormon Station 'Genoa', because of the area's resemblance to the mountainous Italian coastline, where he had been on a mission for the Mormon Church."

The cabin with its various alterations and additions, stood until 1910. That year, a fire destroyed most of Genoa and the cabin. The land stood vacant from then until 1947. In 1945, under the instigation of Representative Otto Hussman of Douglas County, the legislature appropriated \$5,000.00 to build a replica of the original Reese cabin. The State Highway Department was given the task of researching the design and Edward S. Parsons, Department Architect, was given the specific task of drawing a set of plans based on his own research.

Research was performed by studying photographs of the original cabin and noting landmarks therein. From these, camera positions were determined and new photographs were taken to match the sittings of the old. An archeological dig was then made to confirm the site of the old cabin.

Logs were cut close to Genoa and a bare building completed for \$5,000.00. Subsequent appropriations provided electric lighting and display shelves and cases, plus a small section of the stockade fence.

On September 5, 1957, Douglas County deeded the land and building to the State of Nevada for a Historic State Monument. In the spring of 1964, the stockade fence was extended to enclose the grounds as had the original; displays were reorganized and a small campground provided on adjacent lot acquired in 1961 and from an abandoned street deeded to the State in 1963. The monument covers 2-1/2 acres.






