DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Patten building, erected in 1865, is a two and a half story wooden structure in the Italianate style with a gable roof.

The facade features an elaborate first story. The recessed central doorway consists of a pair of double panel doors flanked on either side by shop windows. On one side of the doorway is a large four pane shop window and on the other side is a single four-panel wooden door with a four panel flush light transom. Decorative wooden panels appear beneath all of the windows on this story. enhablature over the first story has a denticulated and bracketted cornice and a frieze consisting of decorative-wooden panels. All of the bays on this story are flanked by pilasters. The second story has two two-over-two windows with decorative lintels; the half story The facade features a pediment with cornice has one similar window. returns and a denticulated and bracketted cornice.

The north and south sides of the building featureffour-bay second stories with two-over-two windows. The first stories have three six-over-sîx windows. The north side also has a shed dormer window in the half story.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The state of the s

The Patten building was erected in 1865 by Frank W. Patten to be used "as a boot and shoe store and manufactory." Over the years, this bimilding has, at one time or another, served as a meat market, a pool hall, a photography shop and a barber shop. By providing the home for so many varied businesses, the Patten building itself became important to the people of Cherryfield and ranks as a local landmark.

This structure is a charming example of a rural store built in the Italianate style. To find such a sophisticated piece of commercial architecture in such a relatively remote location is remarkable.

The building has recently been given to the Cherryfield-Narraguagus Historical Society and is being restored for use as a museum.
